Latin 1 - Grades 6 - 9 (age 11-15)

Latin 1 is a formal high-school yearlong course. It does not lend itself to students joining mid-year. The course consists of chapters 1-20 of Wheelock's Latin, which actively involves students in the reading of classical Latin beginning with the first lesson. The course covers 1st-4th declension nouns and adjectives and the active and passive voices of the indicative mood of all tenses of the four verb conjugations. Students will develop a knowledge of Latin roots in English words. Through this class, students will develop skills in reasoning, analysis and deductive thinking. An academic course and should be considered part of core curriculum for the year.

Students receiving a grade above an 85 may count this for ½ foreign language high school credit.

Students may NOT join this class after the August 16th start date.

Students keep a drawing and research journal, required for weekly graded assignments. Art history will be incorporated into the course both in students' finished pieces as well as in their journal writing. Expect to spend an additional 3 hours on homework for this class. Students supply their own 9x12 hard covered journal. A core curriculum elective and meets the requirements for a Fine Arts course for a diploma.

Must attend all 3 sessions to earn high school credit.
